Those wishing to hire the Casa for a house party will have the run of the 30 bedrooms, courtyard, garden, terrace and swimming pool, and dance the Andalusian night away under the stars. For those in search of room to really stretch out in, with enough land to ensure total privacy, Savills has two remarkable properties on the market, both located in some of Britain's most beautiful countryside. The Breach Estate, above right, set in its own bluebell woods and farmland on the edge of the peaceful Candover Valley in Hampshire, is well suited for any equestrian enthusiasts. As well as the main house, which has six bedrooms, an indoor swimming pool and an integral flat for staff or guests, there are stables, a grain store

(which could be converted into a riding school) and two cottages.

Over in Shropshire, near Market Drayton, the magnificent Peplow Estate, *above left*, would suit avid horticulturalists and organic food-lovers. It's centred on a Grade II*-listed Georgian hall with eight bedrooms, surrounded by the smooth lawns and arbours of a landscaped garden that lead down to a lake. Of particular note is the walled garden, one of the few curved examples in England, filled with asparagus beds and fruit

trees. It's one of three family estates run by Lord Newborough, whose Rhug Organic Farm sells sustainably produced meat around the world. Extending to 681 acres, the estate includes 10 more residential properties.
